ABOUT THE FILM FESTIVAL

The *Shift Your World Film Festival* takes place entirely online over the span of 4 days. Here are some tips, suggestions, and reminders about our first-ever film festival.

How the Film Festival Works

During the live festival, May 6-9, the films are at set times, just like an in-person festival (remember those?). You'll be watching along with thousands of people from across the globe.

After the films, you'll have the opportunity to stay for panels and discussions with filmmakers and experts to go deeper into what you've watched. You're invited to engage with other festival-goers in the live chat at this time — no need to do anything special; the chat box will be right next to the streaming video you're watching.

Film Festival Voting

During the live festival, you're invited to vote for the Audience Choice Award. Voting opens Thursday, May 6 at 5:00pm Pacific and closes Sunday, May 9 at 9:00pm Pacific. On the Festival page, you can vote live for the films you've seen.

Casting your vote is easy — one star means you didn't like it at all, and five stars means you thought it was excellent. We suggest casting your vote right after the film, while it's still fresh in your mind! While you can only vote one time, you can change your vote if you wish.

Film Festival Awards

On the last day of the festival, both audience and jury votes will be tabulated and announced the following week.

Another fun way to engage is to watch the feature films and guess which ones will be selected as the winners from the jury. The jury's evaluation criteria ranges from craft and creativity to a film's likelihood to effect positive change.

On the evening of Sunday, May 9, tune in to watch the Culture Shift Legacy Awards (feature & short). You'll also be invited to stay and watch the films being honored: *Baraka* (feature) and *The Story of Stuff* (short).

The Audience Choice and Jury Award winners will be announced on Monday, May 10 via email and on the website.

Limited to the first 500 VIPs to register for their ticket, you're invited to join us for a special sneak preview of this film festival darling on Saturday, May 15 at 1:00pm Pacific. Immediately after the screening, you'll enjoy a conversation with the filmmakers taking you behind the scenes of the film. *End of the Line: The Women of Standing Rock* is a highly anticipated new documentary by awardwinning director Shannon Kring, that tells the incredible story of a group of Indigenous women willing to risk their lives to stop the Dakota Access oil pipeline construction that desecrated their ancient burial and prayer sites and threatens their very existence.




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


HEAL

The film follows the first troop of Radical Monarchs for over three years, and documents the co-founders' struggle to respond to the needs of communities across the US and grow the organization after the viral explosion of interest in the troop's mission to create and inspire a new generation of social justice activists.


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
KISS THE GROUND


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RIVER OF GOLD

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

BARAKA



Baraka is an ancient Sufi word, translated as a blessing or as the essence of life from which the evolutionary process unfolds. With the theme of human's diversity and our impact upon the environment, Baraka has no narration and no dialogue, yet transcends geography and language to provide a sensual and spiritual experience that enables the viewer to look at the world in a totally different way.

END OF THE LINE: THE WOMEN OF STANDING ROCK is the incredible story of a group of Indigenous women who risk their lives to stop the Dakota Access oil pipeline construction that desecrated their ancient burial and prayer sites and threatens their land, water, and existence in modern America. We follow these powerful women on a 4-year battle, through to when the pipeline was officially ordered to be shut down in July 2020 — a significant blow to the Trump administration and US oil industry. This poignant film features expert testimonies about the effects of colonization and the history of U.S. violations of Indian treaties.
